
Serendip

ere is a picture of our home in Battle Creek, Michigan and our barn. We have lived here since November of 2000, if I recall correctly. As we continue preparing to deploy to Sri Lanka, we become more and more aware of how much stuff we have as Americans and how much we love our stuff. We have

to determine what we are going to keep; what we are going to sell or give away; and what we are going to toss.

After visiting Sri Lanka these two times, it is startling to compare our abundance with their subsistence. It becomes apparent that I could live with much, much less than I now have.



What is apparent to the head is not always so obvious to the heart. We are packaging and laying away numerous boxes of our treasured possessions, thinking that in however



many years it might be, we will open them up and make them a part of our lives again.

Maybe, maybe not. There is no promise that our stuff will be here even tomorrow, let alone years from now. In fact we are assured by our Lord that these things are all passing away. You can keep your barn and stuff it with your goods, but you can be good and sure that moth and rust will still cause decay,

even if thieves don't break in and steal.

But one "motto" of the Reformation was "The Word of the Lord remains forever," as from Isaiah 40:7-8: "The grass withers, the flower fades when the breath of the LORD blows on it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever."
